## **BIOGRAPHIES**

Melanie Henry studied at the Royal Academy of Music. She has performed worldwide with many orchestras and chamber ensembles and also participated in numerous theatre productions.

Her performing career has spanned such diverse institutions as the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, the Royal Opera House, the National Theatre and the contemporary music group Sounds Positive. She is much in demand as a woodwind 'doubler' in the West End and has played in many musicals, including Phantom of the Opera, Les Misérables, Grease and Evita. She teaches at Trinity College of Music and also is a syllabus selector for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music.

Sally Mays is a pianist of international standing, renowned for playing contemporary music, particularly that of her native Australia. She has performed and broadcast as a soloist and chamber musician across the world and returns annually from her home in Kingston-upon-Thames to give recitals and masterclasses in Australia.

She is well known as a teacher and an examiner, and has had many works written for or dedicated to her. Her chamber ensembles include *Sounds Positive* and *Trio Lavolta*. In the 2016 Queen's Honours, she was appointed a Member of the General Division of the Order of Australia (AM).
